Town Votes to Approve the Massachusetts Public Library Construction Project Grant: Since 2011, Library staff, the Library Facility Needs Committee, and the Library Trustees Board have worked to poise the municipality for a Massachusetts Board of Library Commissioners (MBLC) Massachusetts Public Library Construction Project Grant



application which was submitted in 2017. The Town of Westford was waitlisted in FY22 in line for \$7,851,944 million in grant funds. In May 2022, the Town learned that the Division of Administration and Finance had appropriated additional funds for the Library Construction Program and that Westford's provisional grant award notification would be made one year early — in July 2022. Accordingly, on July 7 the Town received provisional grant notification from the MBLC of its \$7,851,994 grant requiring town approval and acceptance, which followed:

- 2022 October 17 Library Project approved at Special Town Meeting [2/3rds vote ensured passage]
- 2022 November 8 Library Project approved at the local ballot [majority support ensured passage]
- 2023 January 9 Deadline to accept MBLC grant Grant formally accepted
- 2023 May Notice of potential supplemental grant from the MBLC in the amount of \$829,263
- 2023 May Designer Selection Committee appointed by Town Manager

By December, library staff began the process of inventorying, shifting, culling, relocating and organizing collections and holdings in preparation for a move to off-site operations in FY25 for the duration of construction. Those plans will be shared with the public as soon as known. We thank here the Permanent Town Building Committee, Finance Committee, Capital Committee, Select Board, Clean Energy and Sustainability Committee, Library

Adult programming continued its monthly Book Groups and Clubs in an all-virtual format, with the *Library Book Discussion Group*, the *Monday Mystery Book Club*, and the *Non-fiction Book Club*. Twenty-nine neighborhood and library and library/school Book Groups were supported by the Inter-Library Loan department. Westford Library is now collaborating with other Merrimack Valley libraries in offering bi-weekly 50+ Job Seekers *Programs* into the future. 
